n the month of January, Bible-believing churches have, for years, designated at least one Sunday as "Prolife Sunday". This Sunday generally falls somewhere around the middle of the month to try and speak against the passage of *Roe v. Wade* on January 22, 1973. Therefore, this strong pro-life stance of our church has not often been the topic of the pastor's newsletter article. Before you assume this article is not for you, I urge you to follow its reasoning to the end.

One of the most public issues in our recent political cycle, was that of abortion – or as many incorrectly tried to label it "women's health." In fact, there was one sub-topic within the pro-life/pro-choice discussion that found wide support from people on both sides of our political spectrum: this year the "protection of IVF" (*In Vitro Fertilization*). What is so sad though is that the largest majority of those Americans talking – and I would submit the largest majority of all Americans – actually believe that this is primarily a political or medical health issue. While there certainly are political and health components to it, IVF is, at its core, a theological and moral issue to which God very clearly and succinctly has given us principles in the Bible that we, as Christian's must place above any of our personal or worldly wants, desires or opinions.

Again, please do not brush this topic off as if it has no application to you, just because you are past the age of having children, or have been blessed by God not to have, or know anyone that has had difficulty bearing children. God makes it your issue and mine as His individual (singular) believers in Proverbs 31:8-9, when He says, "Open your mouth for those who cannot speak. ...judge righteously and defend the poor and needy." There is no human person that is more unable to speak for him/herself and

is more in need of others to defend their very lives than those unborn babies within their mother's womb from the moment of conception. Today in the 21st century, all we need to do is open an *embryology textbook* or type a few words into Google to see that biologists agree that a new human life is formed not at birth, nor at implantation, but <u>at fertilization</u>. It is then that a new genetic code is created and the life of a new human, distinctly different from his/her mother and father begins. That makes this situation about much more than just the mother's body or life.

But what is the concern about IVF? Before I go farther, I want you all to hear me very clearly. I am not writing this to condemn or speak ill of you or anyone else, if you have already perhaps used or tried IVF to have children. In fact, most people have just not thought enough, or been well enough informed about all that is involved in IVF to make the connections to the Biblical implications involved. That's what I believe we heard in the political rhetoric earlier this fall. I am not ignorant to the great suffering involved for a couple that deeply desires to bear children according to God's design. Neither can we believers ignore God's command that we are not to take or end His gift of human life (5th Commandment). But it's hard to name any Christian to whom God doesn't seem to be saying, "Not *this* (whatever the issue may be) on this side of heaven." These are the "thorn in the side" struggles that we face, to which God says, as He did to St. Paul, "My grace is sufficient for you" (2 Cor. 12:7-9). So, please hear me trying as hard as I can, to speak God's truth in love so that we all can grow to live under Him faithfully (Eph. 4:15).

There are two primary Biblical concerns with the practice of IVF. I will try to express them as clearly as I can. The first is the often hidden fact that, according to the *National Library of Medicine* up to 40% of fertilized eggs (human babies) in IVF are never given a chance at life within the mother, and an additional 20% are not successfully implanted within the womb. That means that up to 60% of children made in the IVF process do

not make it to birth (https://pmc.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/articles/PMC7670474/). Fertility doctors have openly said that grading, selecting, and discarding embryos are a critical part of their business model. In order to get some to eventually survive they must make very many fertilized children. Those that are "unused" are then frozen for "future use". The *National Embryo Donation Center* says there are 1.5 million of these frozen babies right now in the U.S. (https://www.embryodonation.org/). Almost all of these will never have a chance at life. Yet God says in Deuteronomy 30:19, "Choose life, that you and your offspring may live."

The second Biblical concern with IVF is the way that it knowingly separates God's intended design in Creation for sex, marriage and babies to be intimately and physically connected with each other. In Genesis, chapters 1 & 2, God created male and female humans to "be fruitful and multiply" (Gen. 1:28) within the "one-flesh" union of marriage (Gen. 2:24). He is the one who opens and/or closes wombs (whether it is a male, female, or both issue), according to His perfect, immutable will. When a couple is unable to conceive, we must then look to Isaiah 55:9 in faith and accept that God is saying, "For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are My ways higher than your ways..." and then prayerfully consider and embrace the honorable and loving gift that God blesses and lovingly offers to both couples and children in adoption. The Father Himself shows how intimate the parent/child relationship in adoption is in the fact that, through Christ, He adopts us into His eternal Christian family in our baptism (Gal. 4:5-6).



Hopefully I have been able to show that the IVF issue, just as it is with abortion, euthanasia, and other life issues, is not really a political or "women's health" issue at its core, but instead these are matters of faith that speak to how God has created us to live in this earthly life in such a way that we honor His gift of life to us and all others; life from the moment that our life begins (fertilization) until it is God's will to bring it to an end and then embrace us in the loving and eternal arms of Jesus our Savior.

It is in His marvelous light that we live, today and forever,




