n our recent five-day vacation to Orange Beach, AL with our daughter's family, I was vividly reminded of the significant *Power of Water*. Where we were at on the gulf coast, the ocean surf was relatively mild. But still, any sand castle that happened to be constructed too close to the water in low tide was quickly and easily obliterated by just a couple series of waves once the tide would rise. And as I found out first hand, more than once, even when I was ready for it, and braced myself firmly against it, any moderate to larger wave could easily knock me off my feet and then try to pull me out to sea. However, the power of those same waves, with the help of a boogie board, could also provide an exhilarating ride all the way to a soft approach on the sandy beach.



This awesome power that God gave to water in His Creation is even more evident in places like the upper Pacific coast where the much larger, crashing waves can destroy entire shorelines and demolish rocks, as well as roadways and homes very quickly and with relative ease.

All of this reminds and instructs us concerning the way that God, in His perfect wisdom, has used and still continues to use the unfathomable power He has given to water as an important part of His salvation plan for all of mankind.

The many examples of miracles that God worked in and through water are too many for us to recount in this brief article, but here in the season of Lent, as we approach our Easter celebration, I'd like for you to consider the following instances in Scripture. Notice especially how God uses water both as an implement of His Law and an instrument of His Gospel.



Obviously, we have the worldwide flood in Genesis, chapters 6-8. As God's implement of Law, Genesis 6:5 & 7 says, "Yahweh saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intention of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually. ... So Yahweh said, 'I will blot out man whom I have created from the face of the land...for I am sorry that I have made them." So, as Genesis 7:22 reports it, "Everything on the dry land in whose nostrils was the breath of life died" in the Flood. Everything, that is, that was still on the dry land when the Flood hit. But God used this same powerful flood of water to do His Gospel work, as Genesis 7:23 says, "Only Noah was left, and those who were with him in the ark."

Not only did God use that water to condemn and destroy those who rejected Him and corrupted His Creation, but He used it to cleanse, save and restore His Creation for the future. Genesis 8:19 tells us, "Every beast, every creeping thing, and every bird, everything that moves on the earth, went out by families from the ark." And Genesis 9:1 says, "God blessed Noah and his sons and said to them, 'Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth."

But, as we know, this enormous sacrifice was still not enough to cleanse mankind of our sinful nature. It points us forward in God's plan to another major water event – The Exodus, where God used water again as His tool of both Law and Gospel. In one of the 10 plagues, God declared His judgement against Pharaoh for enslaving His chosen people, by turning the water of the Nile River into blood. But that was a small, first step. The decisive water event came when Moses brought the people out of slavery only to find themselves trapped at the shore of the Red Sea, with Pharaoh and his army in hot pursuit.

It's then that God implemented His Law and Gospel work when He divided the waters of the Sea both to provide an escape for His people on dry ground, saving them and declaring them to be His chosen nation <u>and</u> to condemn and destroy the evil, unbelieving Pharaoh and his entire army when He closed the waters back

over them. (See Exodus, chapters 13-15)

These and many other miraculous events with water were, and still are, intended by God to point the eyes of our hearts and minds to the cross of Jesus that we focus upon now in Lent and His empty tomb that we celebrate at Easter. So, how is the power of water a part of these central events in our Christian faith?



Consider Paul's words in Romans 6:3-6, "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were <u>baptized into His</u> <u>death?</u> We were <u>buried therefore with Him</u> by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been <u>united with Him in a death like His</u>, we shall certainly be <u>united with Him in a resurrection like His</u>. We know that our old self was crucified

with Him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin." Those selections that I have underlined above show us God's intended, powerful use of the water and Word in baptism both to condemn and destroy our sinful condition and also to cleanse and save us today and for all eternity.

Martin Luther, in his Small Catechism, says this of the power in the waters of baptism that bind us together with Jesus' death on the cross and His resurrection back to life: "What does such baptizing with water indicate?" He answers, "It indicates that the Old Adam in us (our sinful nature and actions) should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, (that's the Law) and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever (that's the Gospel)" (Baptism IV, Luther's Small Catechism, © CPH 2017, pg. 302).

Wow! This is the greatest display of God's power through water that I can ever imagine. God's baptismal water both kills you and me in our sin, and purifies and brings us into eternal life. 1 Peter 3:20-21 even makes the connection between our baptism today and Noah and the Flood, saying, "Baptism, which corresponds to this (the Flood) now saves you...". And Titus 3:5 backs that truth up: "[God] saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but...by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit."

This is why we here at Mt. Calvary keep the Baptismal Font front and center during the Lent and Easter season in our Sanctuary; so that when you walk into Worship, and when you approach the altar at Holy Communion you can't help but be reminded of the life-changing power of God that He used in the water of your baptism. It is then and there that He saved you, through Jesus Christ's saving work on the cross and in the empty tomb.

What a joy to always be dripping with the water of Christ,









At our worship service on the first Sunday in Lent, Pastor Besel read the Gospel lesson from Luke 4:1-13 that told us about the temptation of Christ by Satan. But let us also remember Easter Sunday is coming, a glorious day when our Lord Jesus Christ proclaimed victory over death and the devil. And because He did, our sins are washed away, we are made holy and will be with Him in Paradise.

I also wanted to share, again, the Resurrection Roll recipe. This is a great visual activity to teach/remind all ages of Jesus death and resurrection... (and they taste amazing!) - Corinne Gabel

Easter Resurrection Rolls

Prep Time: 5 mins Cook Time: 10 mins Total Time: 15 mins Servings: 8 rolls

Ingredients

- 1 can Pillsbury Crescent Dough
- 8 large marshmallows
- water cinnamon & sugar mixed together in a bowl

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 375°F. Read **John 19** in the New Testament while the oven is pre-heating. Spray a cookie sheet with cooking spray or line with parchment paper.
- 2. Unroll the crescent rolls, separating each section. Explain that this is like the cloth they wrapped Jesus in.
- 3. Give your child a marshmallow and explain that it represents Jesus. It's white and pure because He was without sin.
- 4. Roll the marshmallow in a small bowl of water. This symbolizes the embalming oils.
- 5. Now, roll the marshmallow in the cinnamon & sugar mixture. This is like the spices used to prepare his body for burial.
- 6. Next up, wrap the marshmallow in the crescent roll dough, making sure to pinch the dough together securely on the sides. Don't worry about what they look like because they'll taste great no matter what! This represents how they wrapped Jesus' body.
- 7. Repeat with each marshmallow and place the rolls in the oven (symbolizing the tomb) and bake for the amount of time specified on the package 8 to 10 minutes or until golden brown on the outside.
- 8. While the rolls are baking, read John 20:1-18.
- 9. When the cook time is up, open the tomb and remove the rolls. When they're cool enough to handle, let your child(ren) open one and discover what happened to the marshmallow. It's disappeared! This signifies how Jesus has been resurrected!
